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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. A student has the right to stop school at any time; and has the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled day in the current payment period in the course through the last day of attendance. Refunds will be dispersed within 45 days following written notification of withdrawal and application for refund. If a student has attended 60% or less of a program (In-class/Didactic) then their refund will be prorated by the percentage attended. If a student has attended more than 60% of a program (In- class/Didactic) then the student is not eligible for a refund. If eligible for a refund, refundable portion does not include \$250.00 registration fee, application fee, uniform, and any equipment. **STUDENTS MUST CANCEL IN WRITING.** You do not have the right to cancel by telephoning the school or by not coming to class.
2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: 1780 E. Bullard, Suite 116. Fresno, CA 93710. This must be done by hand delivery. The written notice of cancellation needs to be on a Notice of Cancellation Form, available upon request.
3. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
4. Student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.
5. If you have completed the program with a grade of 80% or higher but are unable to complete the externship, you may apply in writing, to receive a refund in the amount of \$250 and a certificate of completion for the classroom portion of the course. Students are not eligible to request a refund for not completing their externship if they were, for any reason, terminated from their assigned site.

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Definitions/Footnotes

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.
